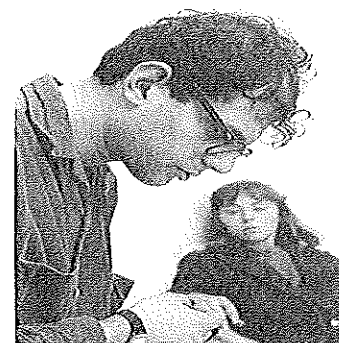
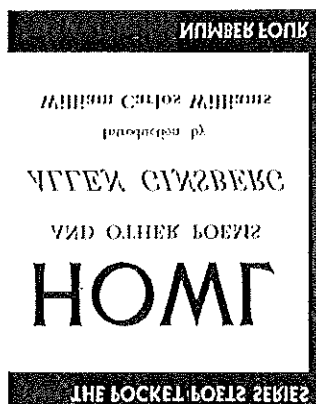
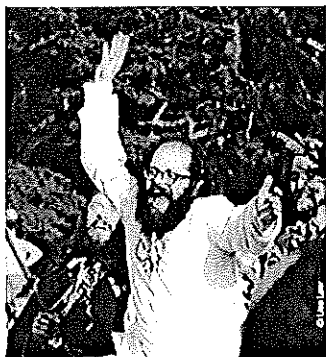


Howling in the Age of Technology

With its famous opening line, Ginsberg's *Howl* still resonates in America's literary consciousness 50 years after its creation. Allen Ginsberg attempted to write a poem spontaneously and with no restrictions. This sense of spontaneous and uncensored expression seems particularly crucial in the digital and technological age we live in today. As the technologies of our expression continue to change, the fears, restrictions, surveillance and censorship of new forms of writing and literary expression also persist and spread.
